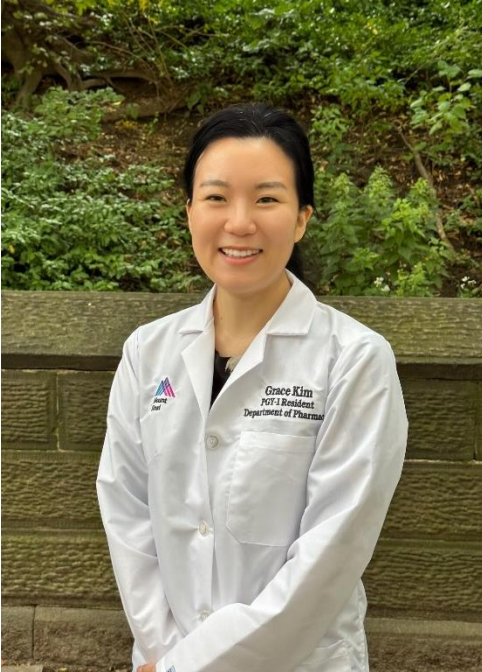

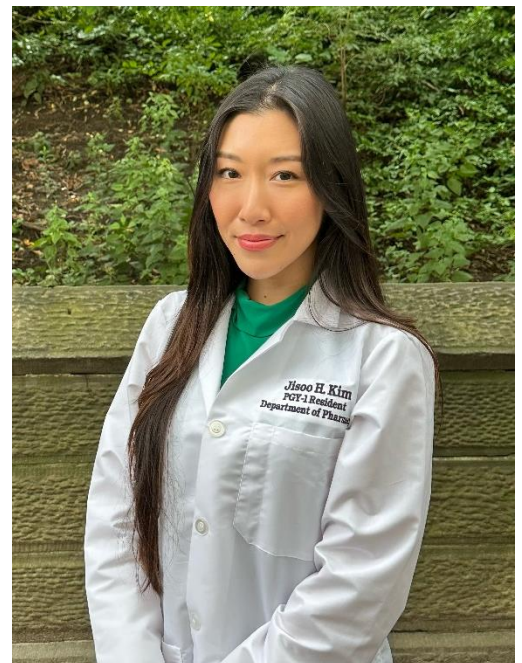


PGY-1 Pharmacy Residents

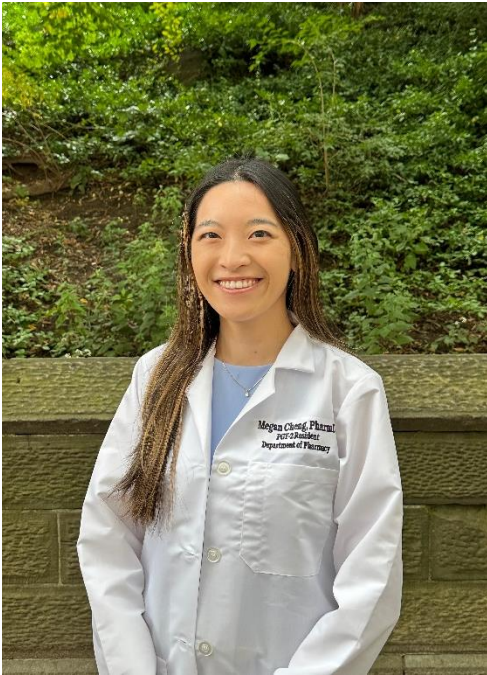

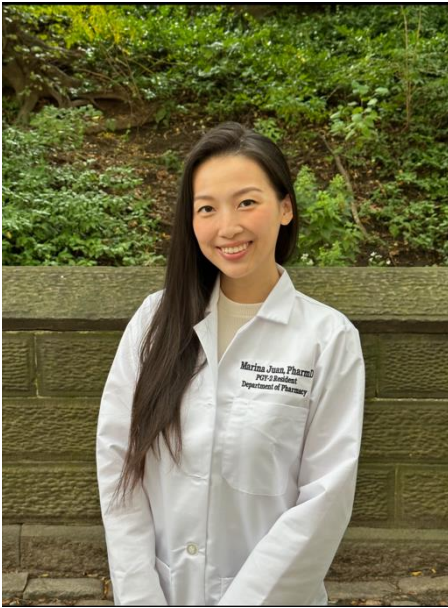
Critical Care
